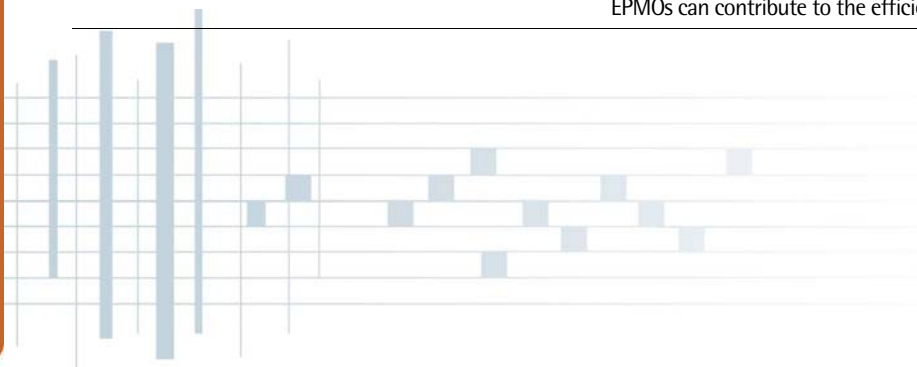

<p>From Models to Reality: Making Complexity Real</p>	<p>Thursday 9 Feb '12 <i>Sydney</i></p>	<p>An abundance of models for understanding project complexity have emerged. The challenge is to operationalize these within the business to derive value. At this workshop, we will focus on understanding the sources of complexity for projects, and the potential range of responses at organizational, governance and project levels. We will present the key points from the two-day Global Workshop on this topic, held in Hong Kong in late 2011, and will focus on the key questions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What are the main sources of complexity within projects across industry and within specific industries? • How do organizations understand and respond to complexity to reduce the associated risks? • How do organizations equip their workforces to understand, respond and manage complexity on projects? • How do organizations build complexity management into their portfolio management capability?

Exploring Knowledge Management & our Failure to Learn</p>	<p>Tuesday 27 Mar '12 <i>Melbourne</i></p>	<p><i>Insanity: doing the same thing over and over again and expecting different results. Albert Einstein (1879-1955).</i></p> <p>Projects, by definition, are temporary organizations with characteristics such as systems thinking, personal mastery, mental models, a shared vision and team learning. These can be difficult to achieve without learning from the past, leaving failures hard to prevent. This workshop will explore how we can accelerate lessons learned from projects and mature the experiences that lead to the reduction of failure. Where the organizational environment provides embedded knowledge designed to improve project delivery, this helps us to learn, change, and take appropriate corrective action.</p>

<p>Resource Management & the Role of the Enterprise PMO</p>	<p>Thursday 31 May '12 <i>Sydney</i></p>	<p>Few projects are delivered successfully by individuals; most are delivered by groups, so it is critical that all project and program resources are effectively deployed. Resource management includes people and subject matter experts, both internal and external, information, financial, and supplies. The most problematic area is about people. This workshop will focus on the labour resource allocation strategies being used in a project environment to gain efficiencies. Members will have the opportunity to share their experiences with EPMOs, to understand more about where and how EPMOs can contribute to the efficient deployment of resources.</p>
